



## Discipline Case Summary – July 2, 2013

### **Working as a physical therapist while non-practising – “professional misconduct”**

Member: Rachel Molder

Rachel Molder had changed her practising status to non-practising and paid her licence fee on that basis. Later, she resumed her practice without changing to a practising licence and paying the required fee.

As a result, she practised without a proper licence, contrary to the Act. One significant effect of practising without a proper licence is that a member’s malpractice insurance becomes void.

As an alternative to a formal hearing, Ms. Molder signed an agreement in which she accepted a formal reprimand. She also agreed to pay costs of \$200.
